What is mentoring?

Mentoring is a relationship between two people where one (the mentor) gives the other (the client) guidance to achieve agreed objectives.

Mentors do not give advice. Instead they help their clients develop their own solutions to business problems. They are impartial and meetings are totally confidential.

Is a Dormen business mentor right for you?

There are a number of questions you can ask about yourself, your business and issues concerning its development that will help you to decide whether a Dormen business mentor is the right type of support for you and your business.



Is your business going in new directions? Could you benefit from a sounding board?

- A mentor can help you review your priorities and plans and is someone you can discuss the options with.
